Schoolwide Title I in the elementary will be financially supported by federal Title and Title Reallocated Funds. A full-time Title I teacher is currently employed in the district with the federal Title IA, IIA, IVA annual funds used to cover the expenditures associated with providing the Title program. Additional funds are not required to implement a schoolwide program. Also, no additional staff are required to be hired. The school is simply in pursuit of receiving schoolwide Title I in the elementary as some students that could benefit from the Title I program are not receiving permission from their parents to register in the Title program.

- 2. CPI Training offered to staff
 - Current Staff Trained
 - Sargent Central provides the opportunity for all staff to go through Crisis Prevention Intervention training. The CPI training is offered as the entire course, and as a renewal option. Sargent Central has 8 CPI trained staff with more signed up each year
- 3. Pre-Kindergarten Program
 - 2014-2016 (Started)
 - o 1 full day a week all day Pre-Kindergarten (Nov.-April)

- Sargent Central started the pre-kindergarten program so that the incoming kindergartners could become acclimated to the atmosphere of the school.
 Program is at no cost to the parents, and school transportation is provided.
- 2016-2017 (Adjusted)
 - 4 days a week all day Pre-Kindergarten
 - Sargent Central Pre-Kindergarten program was expanded to four days, at no cost to the family. Pre-kindergarten is curriculum based.
- 2017-2018 (Adjusted)
 - 5 days a week all day Pre-Kindergarten
 - Sargent Central Pre-Kindergarten program was expanded to five days, at no cost to the family.
- 4. Fresh Fruits and Vegetables offered three days a week PK-6
- 5. Partnership with NDSU extension office to offer adult education
- 6. Vocational and Technical education offered to juniors and seniors at the Southeast Region Career and Technical Center Oakes, ND.
 - Sargent Central gives students the opportunity to take courses at Southeast regioncareer and technical center. These CTE courses offered such as auto, agriculture, and childcare give students the opportunity to learn a specific skill for a career.

 - The school counselor at Sargent Central will work with the student interested in shadowing a career of interest. Some of the past job shadows have been done in hospitals, pharmacies, and Southside Automotive. It is through the job shadows that students can see what exactly the career they are interested would entail.

 - The youth employment and training program is a program that allows students who are in need an opportunity to work and gain real life experience. To be eligible for this program students have to meet certain requirements. An example of this would be a financial need.
