The regular meeting of the school board of Sargent Central Public School District #6 was called to order by President Planteen Wednesday, April 14, 2021 at 6:00 p.m.in the commons area beginning with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by Hoistad seconded by Christianson to adopt the April 14, 2021 agenda as presented. Motion carried.

Brenda Peterson spoke about how she was disappointed with people that were coming to extracurricular activities and were not wear masks when there were signs up say that masks were required in our facility and masks were there at the front door if people needed.

Katherine McLean spoke on the petition she submitted to end mask mandate for all Sargent Central students, which showed overwhelming support from the people of our school district. This petition does not ask to remove masks always under all circumstances. It asks to remove them when our state or county is in the green.

Alex Askerooth spoke on the benefits for our school district and students by having a track facility built. He talked about the income it would bring into our district and businesses in the community.

# Superintendent's Report:

Mr. Warcken,, Superintendent, reported 2022 Thomas bus is scheduled for September delivery, bus #8 windshield has been replaced, bus #3 needs windshield replaced, ESSER II & III funds waiting on money being dispersed, ESSER I funds have been spent, looking into making updates to countertops and slide stove under current kitchen hood, NDIRF is returning over \$6.3 million to its members and we received our check in April, Community Wellness Center advertisers are up, Cognia formerly AdvancED climate and culture surveys sent out will review in May, Trent Nelson will be putting tin up on side of shed, following House Bill 1466 because it would help out Pre-K program, state no longer requiring ACT for junior students, state assessment can act as a replacement, DPI will be paying for the first round of ACT testing for Junior students, working on preliminary 2021-2022 budget, school state aid down the road, tornado drill was conducted and went well, Gast and Comstock Construction to at AC bathrooms.

### Elementary Principal's Report:

Rachel Olson, Elementary Principal, reported that Pre-K screening was held, few teacher took a webinar to dive more into the science of reading, all the teachers are focusing on ending the year strong and working on things they need to focus on yet, taking LETRS training for administrators on system and structure of literacy that coincides with a principal primer for raising reading achievement, all based on science of reading, teacher evaluations are complete, state assessment is done, learned Edmentum exact path individual learning program will be available free again next week if you are showing that you are using the program, April and May will be busy with student activities, presentations and field trips, Math Olympics for grades 4-6 will be held in each school this year and our student did well raising funds of \$650.00 to help support the competition, 5-6 grade will have a modified version of ag safety, other activities DRN internet safety presentations and marketplace for kids, reading extravaganza is on for the elementary of reading goals and fun activities.

### Secondary Principal's Report:

Kylee Roney, Secondary Principal, reported state testing is almost completed, teacher evals are done, regional music was held with several students starring, artist in residence started this week and will conclude next week Wednesday, 2021-/2022 class schedule is nearing finalization, seniors have started prepping for graduation, prom is coming up this weekend with Milnor, state speech is next weekend.

## Athletic Director Report:

Julie Colemer reported that 4-6 grade BBB has finished their season, track is waiting for their first meet, golf has had a few already meets already and baseball has had a few.

Neil Planteen reported that they had seven applicates for Dan's position and have narrowed it down to four and three are in-house applicates, started teacher negotiations.

Jayne Pfau reported that they are working on the budget.

Update on teaching position and discussion.

Motion by Willprecht seconded by Christianson to table discussion on Midwest Dirtworks proposal. Christianson, Hanson, Hill, Hoistad, Pfau, Willprecht and Planteen all voted yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Christianson seconded by Willprecht to accept the high bid for the Chevy Suburban from Joe Meres for \$5,357.00. Hanson, Hill, Hoistad, Pfau, Willprecht, Christianson and Planteen all voted yes. Motion carried.

Any collective decision, collective commitment, or other final action by the governing body must occur after it reconvenes in an open meeting, unless final action is specifically required by law to be taken during the executive session.

We will ask all non-school board members with the exception of the business manager and superintendent to remain outside the library while school board members, the business manager and superintendent convene in the library. We anticipate adjourning the executive session, and reconvening the open portion of the meeting in the commons area, at approximately 9:00 pm.

The executive session began at 8:22 pm and was attended by the school board, superintendent and business manager.
